Joseph S. Mattos, Jr., born in Gloucester on October 4, 1899, son of Mr. & Mrs.
Joseph S. Mattos

Entered military service at the age of 16, with his mother's blessing

Sent to France on August 13, 1917 as a member of Battery A, 5th United States Field
Artillery, regular army.

Private Mattos was killed in action on October 5, 1918, the day after his 19th
birthday.
