IN HONOR OF: A. Piatt Andrew, Director of the U.S. Mint (1909-1910), Assistant Secretary of the Treasury (1910 – 1912), served with the French Army and then the U.S. Army during World War I. Before the United States entered the war, Andrew formed the American Field Service where donated Ford trucks were used as ambulances for French and British soldiers. The French government later presented the City of Gloucester with the Joan of Arc statue to show its appreciation of Andrew. After the war the Massachusetts Congressional District elected him to the U.S. House of Representatives where he served until his death in 1936.
