CHILDREN BOUND OUT AS INDENTURED APPRENTICES  
BY OVERSEERS OF THE POOR

1739-1852

"The idle or industrious apprentice, fed, clothed and lodged by his master, was learning his craft at least 100 years before 1383 when apprenticeship was first noticed in England in an act of parliament. In the 12th century craftsmen were associated in guilds...[that] consisted of masters and apprentices, the masters being those who were skilled in an art, a science or a craft, and the apprentices those who were learning its mysteries."<sup>1</sup>

The 1563 English "Statute of Artificers" stipulated that parents must bind their sons if they had no trade to teach them themselves, and to do so when the boys were 7 years old until they were 21 or 24 years old.<sup>2</sup> Then, in 1601, a Poor Law "required local authorities to bind children whose parents were unable or unwilling to apprentice their children."<sup>3</sup>

"The Massachusetts apprenticeship system, in imitation of that prevailing in England...imposed upon masters responsibility for the moral and bodily welfare of their servants."<sup>4</sup> "By the Massachusetts Bay Act of 1642, masters were also required to see to it that their apprentices learned to read, and the selectmen of the towns were charged with superintending compliance."<sup>5</sup> "Not only was apprenticeship viewed as a mode of poor-relief, and of keeping up the supply of skilled labor, but it was also considered a means of compelling the education of all youth."<sup>6</sup>

"Masters also had the right, indeed a duty, to admonish and correct their servants, and those whose crimes or delinquencies brought them before the courts were, as in the case of children, often remitted to their masters for punishment."<sup>7</sup>

"Yet in Massachusetts... 'servitude' was much more than a means by which one class exacted work from another. 'It was also a school,

where vocational training was combined with discipline in good manners and guidance in religion...."<sup>8</sup> "To that end, wealthy and even aristocratic parents frequently placed their children as servants to the families of friends and even of strangers."<sup>9</sup>

"When a master took an apprentice he was obliged, with the apprentice, to subscribe to a mutual covenant or indenture before reliable witnesses. This document, to be legal, must then be registered or recorded with the town authorities...most of the records of apprenticeship are contained in court, and town-meeting minutes."<sup>10</sup> A search in the Gloucester town meeting minutes shows no record of apprenticeships. Court records were not examined.

Apprenticeship indentures were written agreements. They "contain a number of provisions setting out in some detail the conditions of the apprenticeships. They had to contain an undertaking by the master to train the apprentice, and on the part of the apprentice to serve the master."<sup>11</sup>

The agreement was written in duplicate on one large sheet of paper, each part was signed and witnessed, and the sheet was torn or cut in half by a wavy or jagged line. Each party to the agreement (master and guardian or parent) kept a copy. When a child was bound out by the Overseers of the Poor, the local government kept one copy, the master the other.<sup>12</sup>

The terms generally were universal. Special skill was called "art"; special knowledge, "mystery"; and these, along with food, clothing, lodging, education would be given the child. In return, loyalty, obedience, compliance in all lawful matters, and the promise not to marry, fornicate, gamble or give away the secrets of the master's family or business were demanded. At the conclusion of the term of apprenticeship, the master would supply a new suit of clothing and perhaps other specified items.<sup>13</sup>

In England, the guild system of master, journeyman and apprentice was strictly enforced. A young man could not set himself up in any craft or trade unless his apprenticeship was completed. As a result in England the access to trades was limited and quality monitored.<sup>14</sup>

But in America, there were no guilds to enforce the quality of workmanship or the practice of a craft. If an apprentice ran away in America, he could usually find a place in another colony. And the shortage of laborers and craftsmen meant he could always find work.<sup>15</sup>

However, in both England and America indentured servants and apprentices were at the low end of the social scale above slaves but

with hired servants and unskilled laborers.<sup>16</sup> The ultimate humiliation was to be bound out by the Overseers of the Poor.<sup>17</sup>

The apprenticeship system fell apart beginning at the time of the Revolution. Apprentices often served in the army in the stead of their masters, and gained a "certain ascendancy" over the master if they returned to his household. The economy in the first quarter century of the new Republic fluctuated to such an extent that masters were reluctant to sign on an apprentice for a long term. And the "mysteries and arts", so jealously guarded for centuries by craftsmen, were being given away in how-to books of the late 18th century, written by masters, printed, and sold for profit.<sup>18</sup>

Apprentices became a traditionally rowdy group with less and less reverence and respect for their masters. A young man could learn a trade from a book or a school and set himself up in a community without ever being an apprentice.<sup>19</sup>

The City of Gloucester Archives contain Overseers of the Poor indentures of over 370 children whose parents were dead or too poor to provide for them, bound out as apprentices from 1739 to 1852. These legal contracts obligated the apprentice to work for the master for a given length of time: boys until they reached the age of 21, girls until 18 years. The indentures of children were signed with the consent of the child's parent or guardian.

Records that show how idle or industrious these children were or whether the masters were oppressive or benevolent have yet to be located and researched. If both parties agreed to end the contract, copies were exchanged and destroyed or cancelled on the back.<sup>20</sup> Only 7 Gloucester indentures were recorded cancelled.

Data from the apprenticeship indentures is arranged in five different ways to facilitate the use of the material by researchers.

The indentures were transcribed by John C. Reilly and compiled by Mary Ray with immeasurable assistance from Sarah V. Dunlap, Noel A. Mann, Priscilla Kippen Smith, and Edith M. Sparling.
