## DIVISION 6B. - THE LINZEE COOLIDGE PHILANTHROPY AWARD COMMITTEE

### Sec. 2-477. - Purpose.

The Linzee Coolidge Philanthropy Award is hereby created in honor and recognition of the contributions made by Linzee Coolidge through the Dusky Foundation to organizations which benefit the citizens of Gloucester. The Linzee Coolidge Philanthropy Award is created to foster philanthropy in Gloucester and to encourage others to model their philanthropic giving on Linzee Coolidge's generosity and commitment to the civil community of Gloucester.

### Sec. 2-478. - Criteria.

The Linzee Coolidge Philanthropy Award is the highest honor for philanthropic giving, financial or otherwise, to be bestowed by the City of Gloucester. As such, the Linzee Coolidge medallion may be awarded to individuals who demonstrate substantial generosity and contributions to the City of Gloucester which meet or exceed the contributions in the tradition of Samuel Sawyer and Linzee Coolidge.

### Sec. 2-479. - Medallion.

The Linzee Coolidge Philanthropy Medallion shall be awarded to a citizen in appreciation for outstanding generosity, caring and notable philanthropy which has contributed to the betterment of the community.

### Sec. 2-480. - Committee.

- (a) There shall be a Linzee Coolidge Philanthropy Award Committee which shall consist of four persons appointed by the mayor. The mayor shall serve on the committee and shall be the fifth member thereof. The terms of the members shall be coterminous with the Mayor.
- (b) None of the four appointed members of the committee shall hold any elective or appointive office with the government of the city when appointed, and should they later hold such an office, their membership on the committee shall be declared vacated. The committee shall serve an executive function within the administration of the mayor's office.

**RE: Repeal of Code of Ordinances Chapter 12 Marshlands Sec. 12-27 Floodplain Management**

With the recent passage of the new Section 5.5 Floodplain Overlay District (FOD) to the Gloucester Zoning Ordinance, the current provisions in the Gloucester Wetlands Ordinance (Code of Ordinances Chapter 12 Marshlands) pertaining to floodplain management (Sec. 12-27) will become obsolete as of June 1, 2023. Due to the uncertainty of the zoning amendment process, the repeal of this section was not advanced at the time of initiating the zoning amendments to accommodate for the time needed for review, approval or disapproval, and/or a delay in the effective date. The latter occurred with City Council approving an effective date of the FOD as June 1, 2023. The maintenance of the provisions of Sec. 12-27 Floodplain Management provided the necessary continuity of compliance with the National Flood Insurance Program, which will now be assumed by the language of the FOD zoning ordinance. Please forward this to the City Council for its referral to the Ordinance and Administration Standing Committee and review and approval.



## Existing

### **Sec. 12-27. Floodplain area boundaries and base flood elevation data.**

The floodplain areas are herein established which include all special flood hazard areas within the City of Gloucester designated as Zone A, AE, or VE on the Essex County Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) issued by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for the administration of the National Flood Insurance Program. The map panels of the Essex County FIRM that are wholly or partially within the City of Gloucester are panel numbers 25009C294G, 25009C0309G, 25009C0311G, 25009C0312G, 25009C0313G, 25009C0314G, 25009C0316G, 25009C0317G, 25009C0318G, 25009C0319G, 25009C0338G, 25009C0432G, 25009C0451G, 25009C0452G, 25009C0453G, 25009C0454G, 25009C0456G, 25009C0457G, 25009C0458G, 25009C0459G and 25009C0476G dated July 16, 2014. The exact boundaries of the Floodplain Areas may be defined by the 100-year base flood elevations shown on the FIRM and further defined by the Essex County Flood Insurance Study (FIS) report dated July 16, 2014. The FIRM and FIS report are incorporated herein by reference and are on file with the building inspector, city engineer and city planning offices.

That the construction or renovation of all new municipal buildings including schools shall be fitted with as much Renewable Energy Equipment as possible. Any additional electricity and/or revenue generated by Renewable Energy equipment beyond a net zero shall be shared with the City of Gloucester.

This condition must be met prior to a bid for construction and be factored into any loan authorization.

Municipal buildings in the historic district are exempt from this provision.

If the administration or school administration can demonstrate that the building is not suitable for Renewable Energy equipment as far as amount of sunlight or if the estimated return on investment is greater than 15 years, said building may also be exempt from this ordinance.

**FURTHER ORDERED** that is matter be referred to the Ordinances & Administration Standing Committee for review and recommendation to the City Council.

**DATE:** May 31, 2023**RE:** Proposed Ordinance requiring that the City consider sustainable design and construction in all municipal building projects.

The Gloucester Clean Energy Commission (CEC) has been asked by the City Council Ordinance and Administration Standing Committee to review and make recommendations relative to a proposed new ordinance. This ordinance would require the City to consider ways to maximize energy efficiency, renewably-sourced electricity and other de-carbonizing sustainable technologies in the design and construction of all municipal projects, both for new construction and renovation. If the sustainable technology could not be accommodated in the project initially, the building design should provide for easy future conversion and retrofitting (for example; solar-ready roof, wiring ready for EV chargers and heat pumps, etc.).

The recently completed Gloucester Climate Action and Resilience Plan (CARP) states the intent to provide for sustainability in the design and construction of City buildings and facilities including schools, but that intent has not yet been translated into specific requirements in the ordinances that apply to municipal projects. Knowing that design and construction of some major City building projects are expected in the next few years, and that the adoption of the State's Specialized Stretch Building Code might be far in the future, City Councilor Jeff Worthley was concerned that he could not find any language in the Gloucester Code of Ordinances that committed the City government to requiring the highest feasible standards for sustainability in the design and construction of its City buildings, starting now. At a time when residents and businesses in the City will be faced with new requirements aimed at climate protection, Mr. Worthley wanted the City to lead the way toward sustainability in its own projects.

Mr. Worthley's draft ordinance came to the CEC in November 2022. In the months since then, the CEC has discussed the proposal at several posted CEC meetings. While the members all concur with the general intent of the draft ordinance, we were concerned with ensuring that the sustainability mandate affects the earliest planning and design phase of a municipal building project, and is incorporated into designer selection, design specifications, construction plans and bidding documents (all of which are also bound by the State Designer Selection, Construction Bidding and Stretch Building Code laws, and by local zoning ordinances). The CEC also thought that the ordinance should not create additional layers of submissions, reviews and approvals in an already complicated approval process. The goal would be to add sustainability

to the criteria used by the existing Boards and Committees that are already required players in the design and construction of City projects. These would include the Designer Selection Committees and City Building Committees, and also the Planning Board and Community Development Department as part of their project approval process, as provided for by Sections 5-2 through 5-5 of the City Charter, Article 5.

Based on the CEC discussions with Councilor Worthley, we prepared a revised version of the original draft ordinance, which is attached to this letter as page 3. Rather than simply recommending approval of our revised version, it is our hope that our version will be further reviewed by the City Council and the several Boards and Departments who play a role in the design and approval of municipal projects, and by the City Attorney, with the goal of coordinating and cross-referencing the new ordinance as smoothly as possible into the existing review structure, and the other local and State laws that apply to municipal construction projects.

It would be a significant advance in the implementation of the City's CARP plan if the sustainable design and construction mandates in the proposed ordinance could go into effect in time to improve the carbon footprint of the City projects currently in the "pipeline" of design and approval. The CEC would be happy to arrange for one or more CEC members to attend City Council or other meetings to work on further adjusting the proposed ordinance as additional feedback is received.

**Revised Version: Proposed Ordinance to Require Consideration of Sustainable Design and Technology in municipal building projects.**

*Ordered that, pursuant to Article 5 of the City Charter, the Gloucester Code of Ordinances BE AMENDED by adding to Chapter 5, "Building and Building Regulations", Article IV. "Construction and Restoration of City -owned Buildings", a new Section 5-62 as follows:*

**Section 5-62**

1. The purpose of this Section 5-62 is to apply the principles of sustainable design, construction, and usage to City-owned buildings. The basic objectives of sustainability are to reduce consumption of non-renewable resources, minimize waste, create healthy environments and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

2. In order to apply these principles, the following sustainable technologies will be considered during the design process, prior to the application for a Building Permit or commencement of any work for the construction, renovation or remodeling of a City-owned Building ("the Work"). These Technologies shall include, but not be limited to:

Energy Efficiency and Conservation such as HVAC Systems, Lighting Controls, Weatherization;  
Renewable Energy such as Solar, Wind, Hydro;  
Water Conservation;  
Waste Management;  
Transportation Efficiency such as electric vehicle charging stations, pedestrian walking paths, bicycle paths;  
Usage of Environmentally Low Impact Building Materials;  
Operational and Maintenance Practices;

collectively hereinafter referred to as Sustainable Technologies.

3. In the event that certain Sustainable Technologies are not economically or otherwise feasible at the time the Work is to commence, the Work shall be designed and made so that it facilitates and optimizes the retrofitting, installation and usage of Sustainable Technologies at some future point after completion.

4. This Section 5-62 shall be administered in accordance with Article 5, "Planning and Community Development", of the City Charter.
