Addendum to

Before we start making a list of the known persons who have lost their battle for life against insurmountable odds at or on the sea, it will be well to consider the first known marine disaster that occurred on Cape Ann.

It was on the 15th of August 1635 that what became a full blown hurricane struck the New England coast. At Pemaquid, Maine, now Bristol, the ANGEL GABRIEL was dashed to pieces. On Cape Ann a pinnace bound from Ipswich to Marblehead was splintered on Thatcher's Island. Of the 23 persons aboard only two survived, Mr. Anthony Thatcher and his wife. The Rev. John Avery with 20 others perished. Men have been trying to conquer the sea ever since, often at their peril, many times to their end. (History of Newbury, Newburyport and West Newbury by Joshua Coffin, reprint of 1845 edition published by S. G. Drake, Boston, pp. 18 and History of the Town of Gloucester, Cape Ann by John J. Babson, 1860, Proctor Brothers, pp. 47-49.)

George H. Procter published a list of "fourteen hundred and thirty-seven names, and two hundred & ninety seven vessels, including the 111 men lost in the gale of 24 August 1873" in the Fishermen's Memorial and Record Book, published by Procter Brothers, Gloucester in 1873. It covered the years 1830 to 1 Oct 1873.

Deaths at Sea, the Port of Gloucester, an index to the above publication was published by Walter H. McIntosh of Topsfield, MA in 1983.

The Archives Committee of Gloucester on reviewing "Vital Records of Gloucester, Massachusetts to the End of the Year 1849, Vol III, Deaths, published by Essex Institute, Salem, MA, 1924 found nearly 400 additional records of deaths at sea from 1635 to 1849. More records of death were found in Notes and Additions to the History of Gloucester by John J. Babson, 1876, M. V. B. Perley, Telegraph Office, Gloucester, Mass.

As this information is of interest to genealogists and historians; it seemed that an addendum to include all known deaths at sea from Gloucester to 1849 would be a worthwhile source document to Procter's Memorial Book.

Included in these extracts are those persons noted as lost and/or drowned at sea. Those who died from known or unknown causes, other than drowning, while engaged in foreign trade or in foreign ports, or while privateering, and passengers are also included. Their bodies in most cases were not returned for burial.

It is expected that the on-going efforts of the Gloucester Archives Committee will add to the list as research efforts continue.
